## **RECOMMENDATIONS FOR CARPET SEAMING:**

- 1. To reduce smoking and odors, keep seaming iron clean. Adhesive buildup can reduce the iron temperature by 100°F.
- 2. Seam location is important. Run the seam towards the light source. This will minimize the possibility of shadows highlighting the seam.
- 3. Prior to installation test a sample piece of carpet. Be sure the backing you are trying to seam is suitable for seaming with hot melt carpet seaming tape.
- 4. Be sure the edges of the carpet are flat before seaming by trimming both carpet edges straight and back-roll.
- 5. Be sure all seams are rolled immediately.
- 6. Be sure the iron has a heat shield to protect against excessive heat transfer that can shrink and curl synthetic backing and yarns.
- 7. To eliminate possible shading along the seam, seam in the direction of the nap. Keep the iron moving at a steady rate.
- 8. Be sure that the hot melt is fully activated, and that you get into the adhesive before it has time to cool.
- 9. As the iron is moving down the seam, guide the carpet off the rear of the iron and press it firmly into the hot adhesive and immediately roll the seam.
- 10. Use a pull behind weight as you seam, to make sure the carpet backing does not pull loose from the tape before the hot melt has time to set properly.
- 11. Prior to stretching with a power stretcher, allow enough cooling time, approximately five to eight minutes.

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
